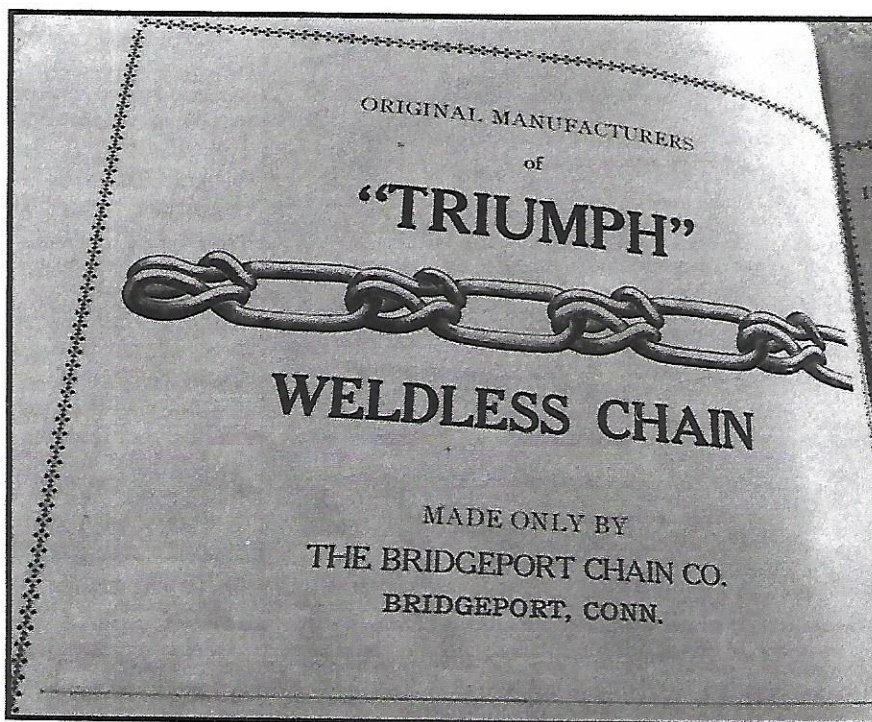


A "Triumph" chain not made by the Triumph Trap Company

The school sold advertisement space in the yearbook. A company by the name of Bridgeport Chain Company advertised their "Triumph" weldless chain in it. The chain is the classic Blake & Lamb style chain. Although the Triumph Trap Company had been in business for six years by then, it is doubtful that this chain was made by them.
