

Delayed

The July 1920 issue of Hunter Trader Trapper was delayed because part of the building that housed their binding equipment collapsed. Below is the description from the magazine.

The accompanying photograph reproduced from the Columbus Daily Dispatch of June 27, 1920, tells more than we can in many words, of the serious accident that befell the Hunter-Trader-Trapper building. A portion of the rear fourth floor collapsed, causing half of HTT magazine and binding equipment to fall to the street. Telephone and power lines were torn down when the wall gave way and many magazines, paper, machinery, truck, etc., were damaged. This necessitated a hurried temporary change in machinery to another building in order to finish the July issue of HTT, hence the tardiness of this issue in the hands of our subscribers. Every precaution is taken to put the defective parts up in a substantial way and things are now being rushed to get back in smooth running order, so that the near future will see the magazine out on scheduled time.
