

Job Description - Pediatric Occupational Therapist - PRN

TITLE: Pediatric Occupational Therapist - PRN

STATUS: Contract, PRN

REPORTS TO: Director of Therapy Services

General Function: The Occupational Therapist is responsible for treating assigned patients as

appropriate and per established policies and procedures; ensuring effective

development and application of occupational therapy programs and treatment procedures; ensuring optimal assigned patient scheduling,

satisfaction and appropriate insurance billing and coding.

REQUIRED EXPERIENCE: The candidate must hold an Indiana Occupational Therapist license. Two

years' experience with pediatric occupational therapy preferred.

REQUIRED EDUCATION: Bachelors or Master of Occupational Therapy degree from an

Occupational Therapy accredited program.

CERTIFICATIONS: Maintain current Indiana therapy license and CPR/First Aid Certification;

maintain professional malpractice insurance – minimum level: \$1,000,000

each occurrence/\$3,000,000 aggregate.

- The PRN Occupational Therapy position works closely with our physical and speech therapists to ensure quality outcomes. Each session consists of time spent in our newly remodeled clinic as well as time spent utilizing the movement of the horse as a treatment tool.
- TherAplay is seeking a dedicated OT PRN who is available to work afternoon hours and who has same day availability. Our PRN staff ensures that patients receive continuous skilled therapies as recommended per their plan of care when their main therapist takes time off.

- Ability to incorporate a basic understanding of human behaviors, developmental needs, physical needs, emotional needs, and comfort during all interactions.
- American Hippotherapy Association Level I and Level II preferred but not required.

- 1. Treat assigned patients as scheduled.
- 2. Maintain timely and quality patient documentation in accordance with TherAplay's best practices.
- 3. Communicate about coverage availability with 24 hours of request
- 4. Confer with the patient's caregivers and other providers as appropriate to plan, implement and assess effective plans of care.
- 5. Always maintain patient confidentiality and conform to HIPAA privacy regulations.
- 6. Other duties as assigned.

PHYSICAL/ENVIRONMENTAL REQUIREMENTS:

- Ability to lift 50 pounds overhead
- Ability to walk up to 10 miles per day
- Ability to work around horses
- Ability to sustain frequent
 - Standing
 - Walking
 - o Bending (forward and sideways)
 - o Grasping
 - o Twisting at the waist
 - Squatting
 - Kneeling
