

SPIRIT OF OLD ERIN TO FILL CITY AS IRISH STAGE PARADE

St. Patrick's Day Celebration, Wednesday, Also to Include Mass Meeting and Church Services

The spirit of old Erin will permeate Indianapolis Wednesday and everybody who can claim Irish blood will be bedecked with the shamrock when the annual St. Patrick's day celebration is held under auspices of the Ancient Order of Hibernians.
